Thank you for purchasing the **Rainbow Hierarchy** extension! We hope you enjoy using the product and that it makes your game development project a success.

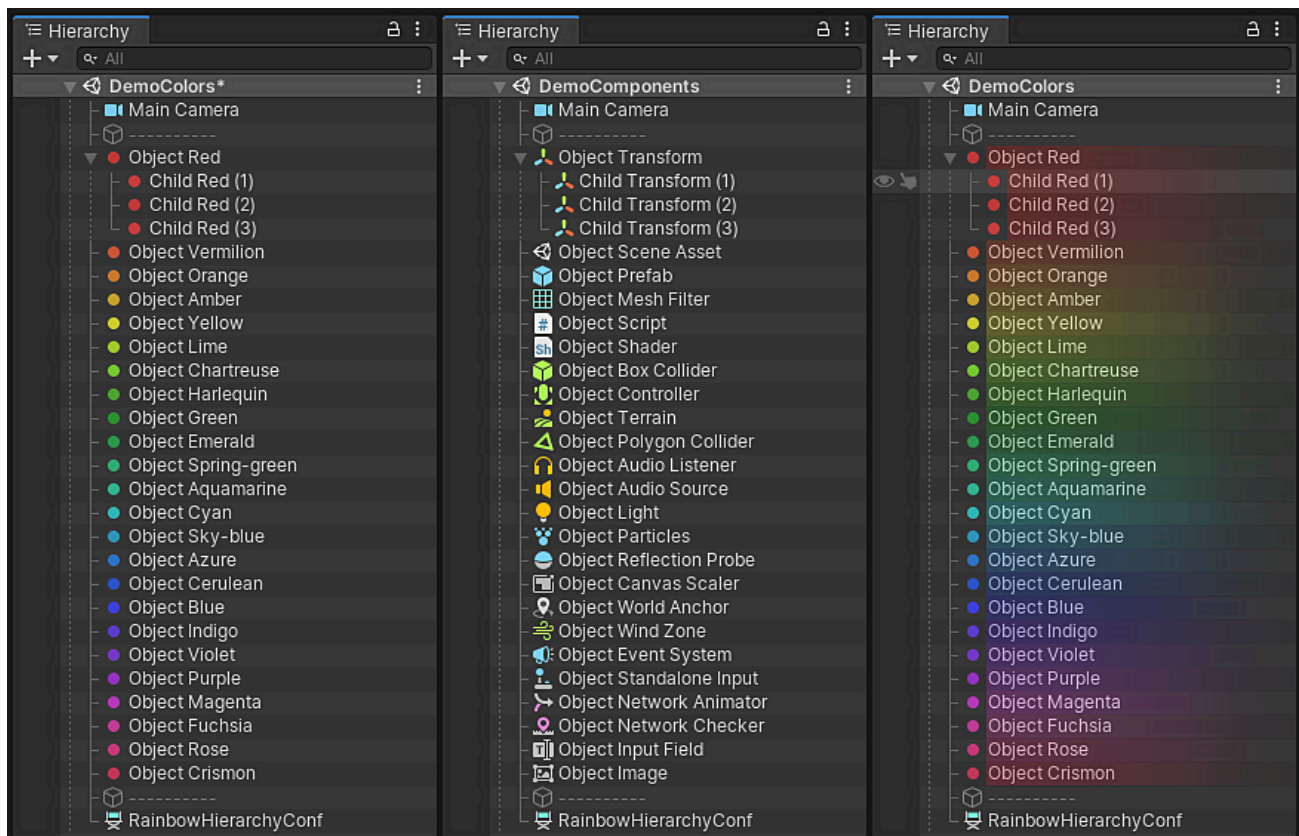

## Overview

Have you ever thought about highlighting often-used GameObjects in your scene? This simple but colorful asset allows you to do that!

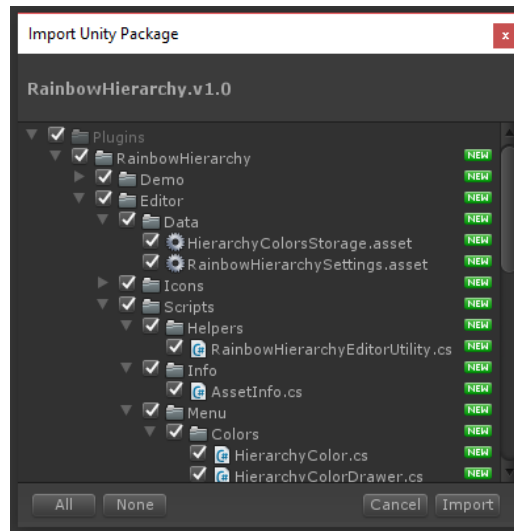
With **Rainbow Hierarchy**, you can set a custom icon and background for any object in the hierarchy window:



## Installing

**Rainbow Hierarchy** is a standard Unity extension and should be installed like any other Unity package. Just drag the `RainbowHierarchy.unitypackage` into your current project, or in the Editor go to the drop-down menu **Assets** → **Import Package** → **Custom Package** and then browse to the `RainbowHierarchy.unitypackage` file.

When downloading from the Asset Store, then the Download Manager will automate the process.



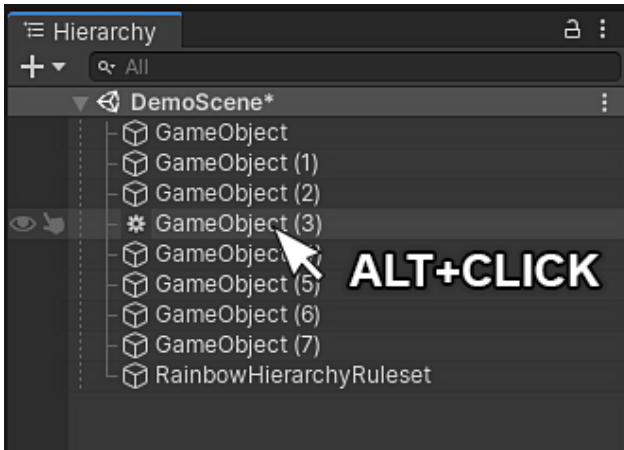
Once the Importing dialog appears, just click the Import button.

## Folder location

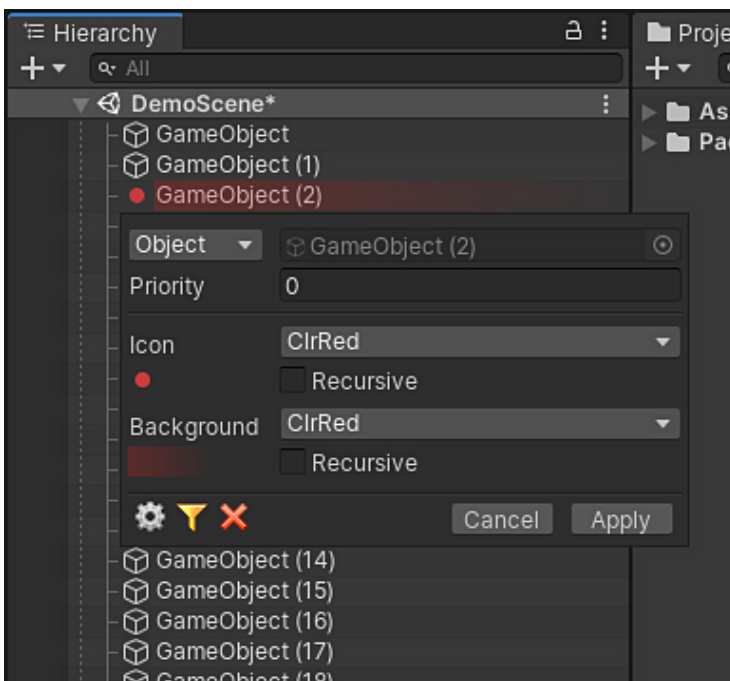
The package will be imported into the `Assets/Plugins/Borodar/RainbowHierarchy` folder by default. Most users prefer to keep it here, but you can freely move it wherever you want. Rainbow Hierarchy will detect new location automatically, no additional actions are needed.

## Configuring hierarchy icons

To apply a custom icon and/or background for some GameObject in your Hierarchy view, just hold the **Modifier** key and click on this object. By default, it's the **Alt** key, but you can change it in **Project Settings** → **Borodar** → **Rainbow Hierarchy**.



The configuration dialog will appear, and you'll be able to assign a custom icon and background to the corresponding object.



What you need to configure for each custom hierarchy rule, are these fields:

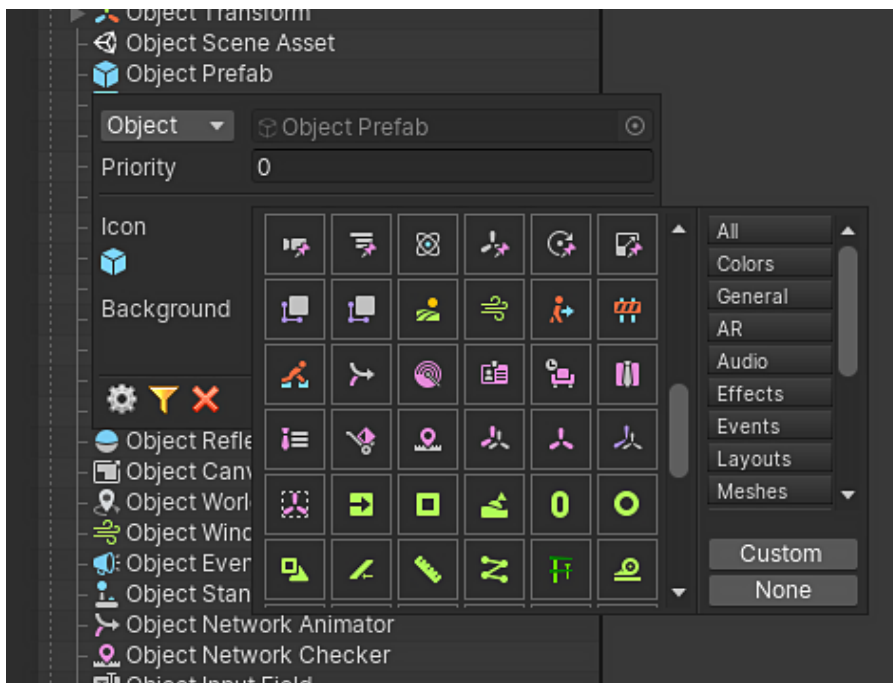
- **Object** - the rule will be applied just to the specified GameObject.  
or **Name** - the rule will be applied to all GameObjects with that name.
- **Priority** - if there is more than one rule that should be applied for the same hierarchy item, then the rule with the highest priority will be applied.
- **Icon** - a custom icon that should be applied to the corresponding GameObject. You can choose it from presets or apply your own texture.

- **Background** - a custom background that should be applied to the corresponding GameObject. You can choose it from presets or apply your own texture.
- **Recursive** checkboxes - the same icon or background will be applied automatically to all child objects.

Your changes will be applied next time the Hierarchy view retrieves focus.

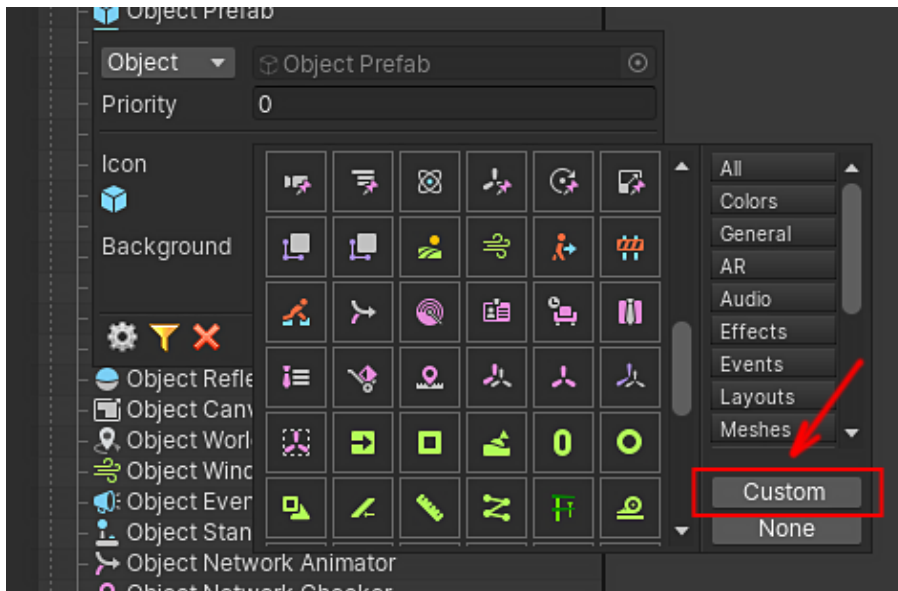
## Presets

You can choose icons and backgrounds from a few dozen of presets. Simply click on the corresponding field in the configuration dialog, select one of them from the popup and apply changes.

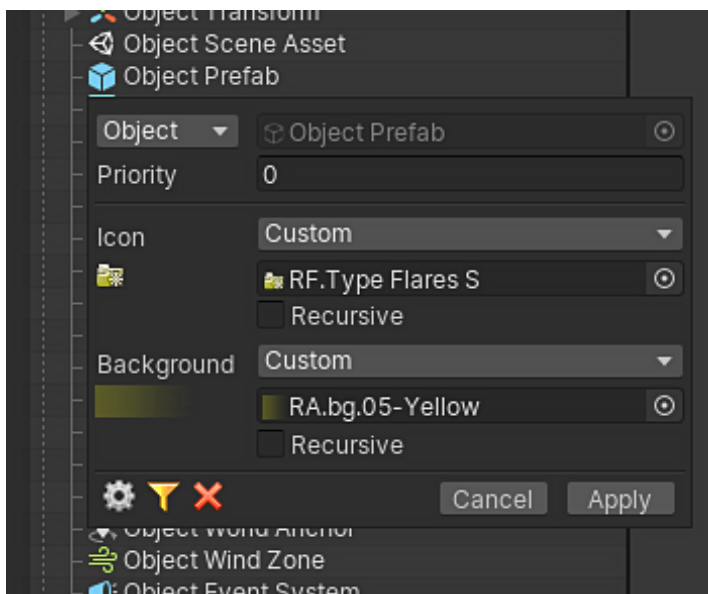


## Your own icons

If you want to apply your own texture as a folder icon or background then click on the corresponding field in the configuration dialog. The icon selection popup will appear and it will have the “Custom” button you should click on.



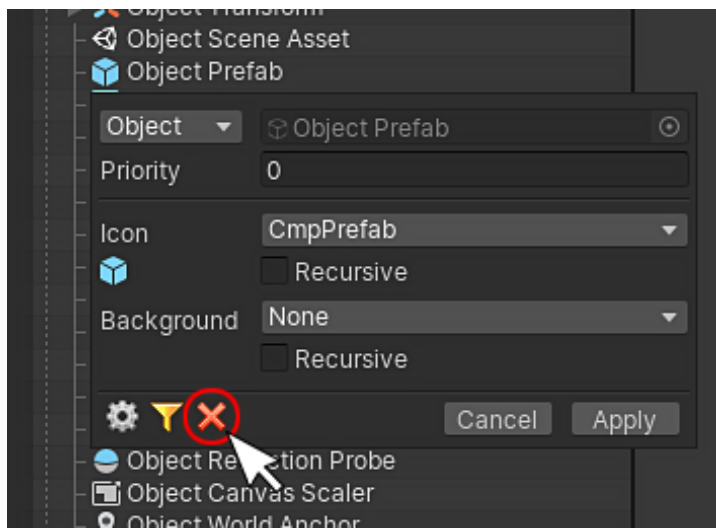
In this case, additional texture input fields will be shown to allow you to drag your own textures here:



The recommended size for a custom icon is **16x16 px**. Regarding background texture, its height should be **16 px** and the width could be arbitrary.

## Revert to default

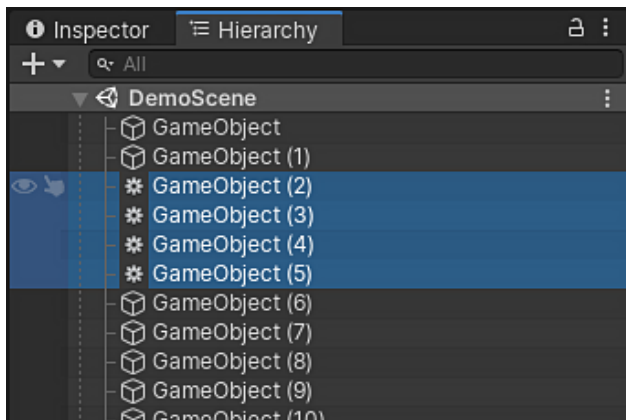
To reset the icon and background to the default state, just **Alt-click** on the corresponding object, then press the red cross button in the configuration dialogue and apply changes.





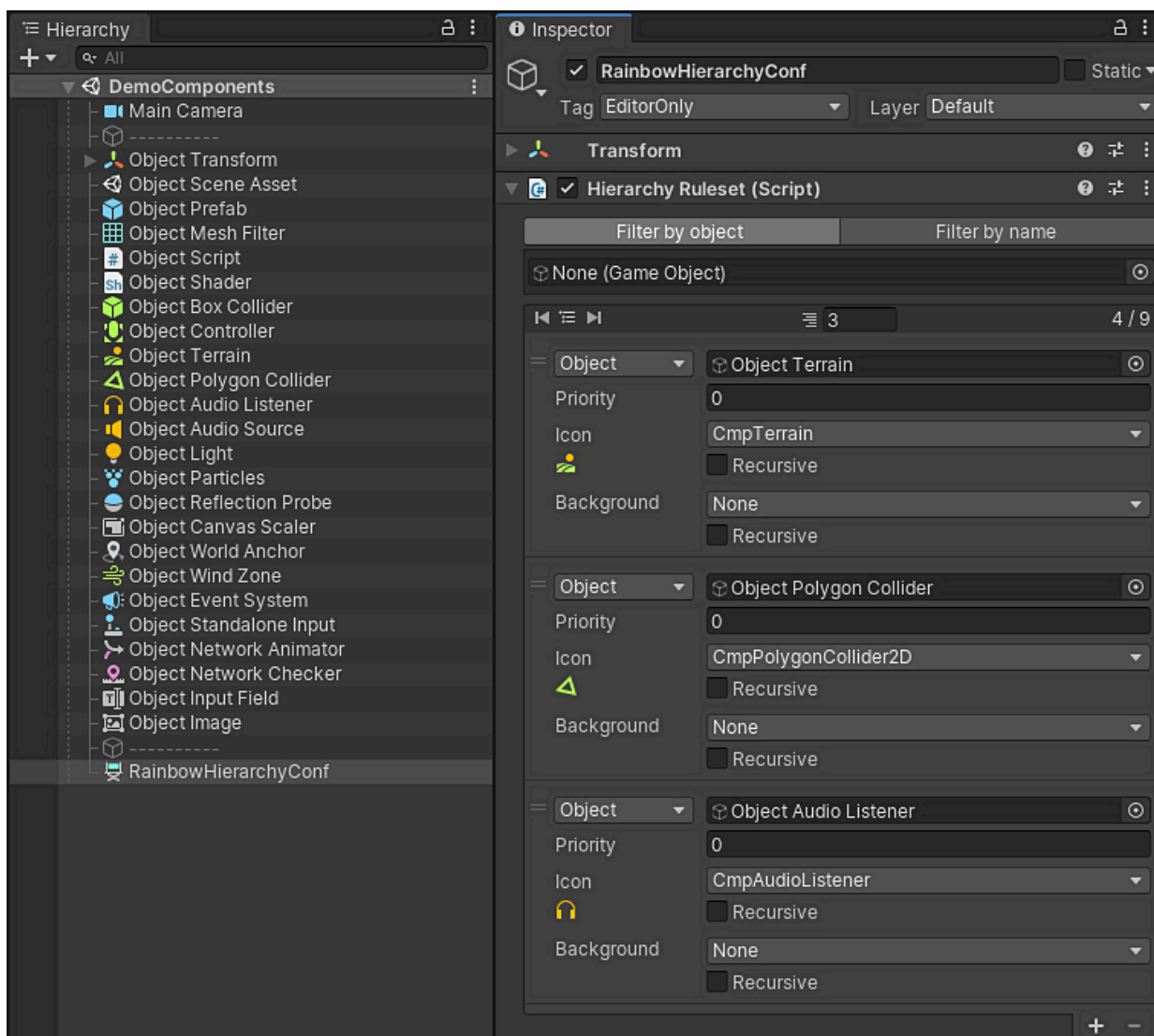
## Multi-editing

You can also apply an icon or background to multiple objects at once, just select them all and **Alt-click** at one of them.

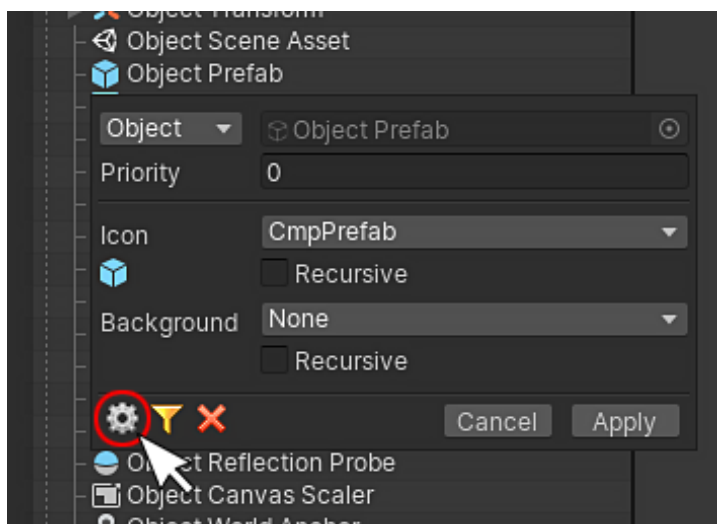


## Manage rules directly

To view all existing assignments, select the “**RainbowHierarchyRuleset**” object in your scene, then take a look at the Inspector.



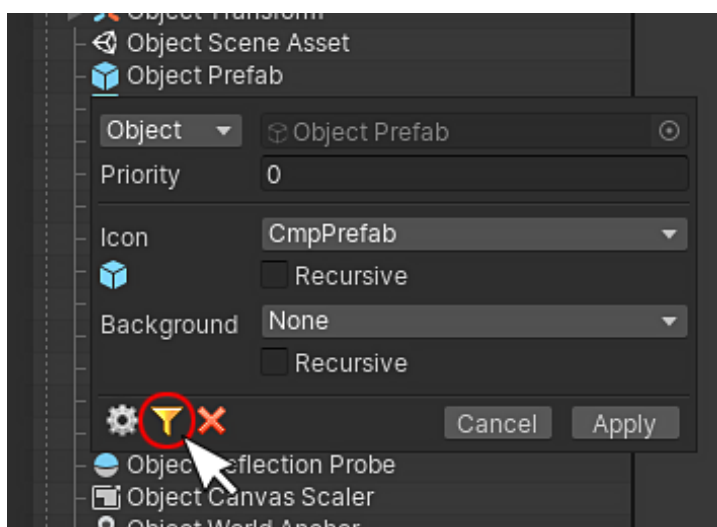
You can achieve the same result by clicking on the “**gear**” button in the configuration dialog.



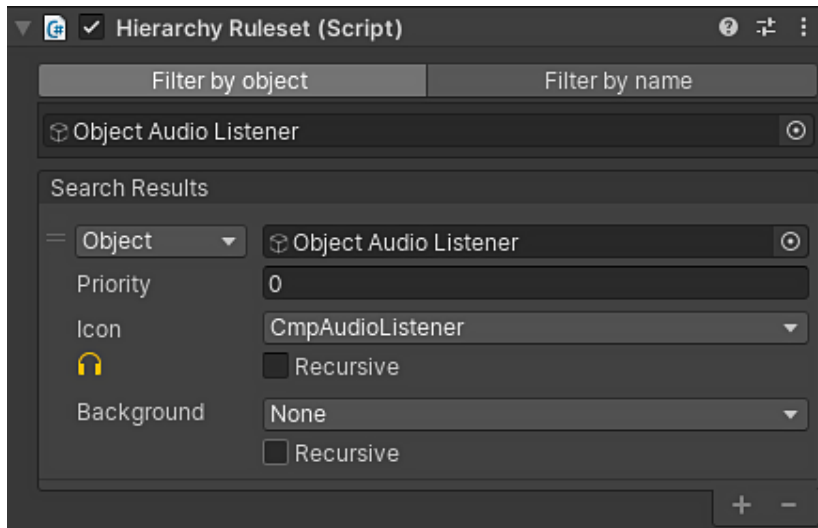
There is a reorderable list with all defined "icon/background" rules. You can modify existing items, remove them using the "-" button or add new ones by clicking the "+" button below.

If there is more than one rule for the same hierarchy object (including recursive assignments), then a rule with the **highest priority** will be applied. If the rules have the same priority then the **latest (lowest) item** in the list will be applied.

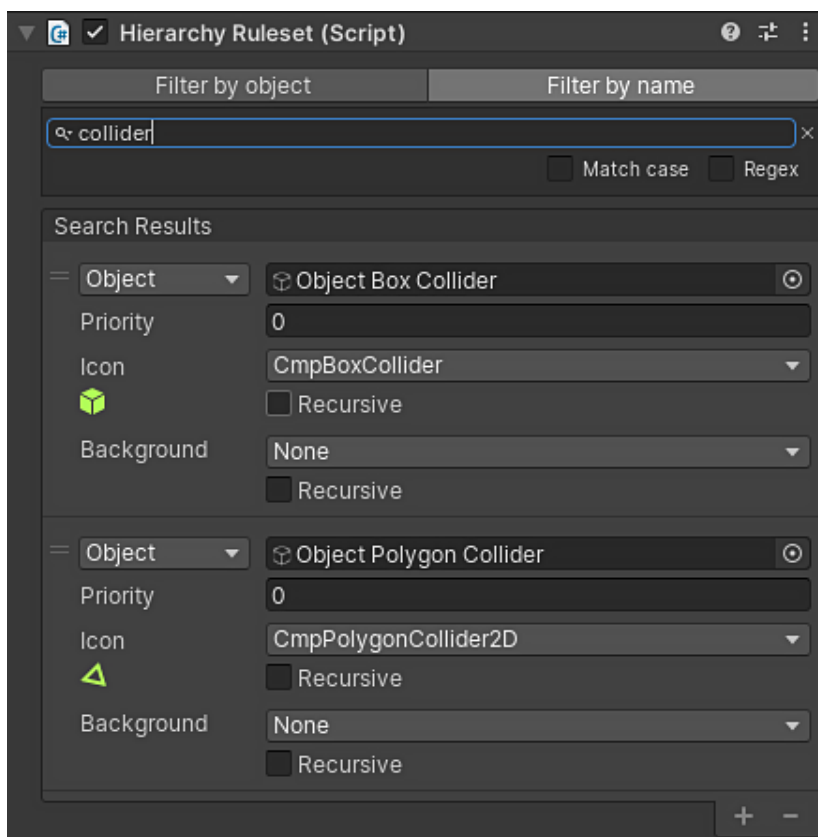
To view rules for a specific GameObject only, click on the “**filter**” button in the configuration dialog. The whole ruleset should be filtered out and only rules related to this GameObject should be shown.



You can also achieve this by using the **“Filter by object”** tab directly in Inspector.



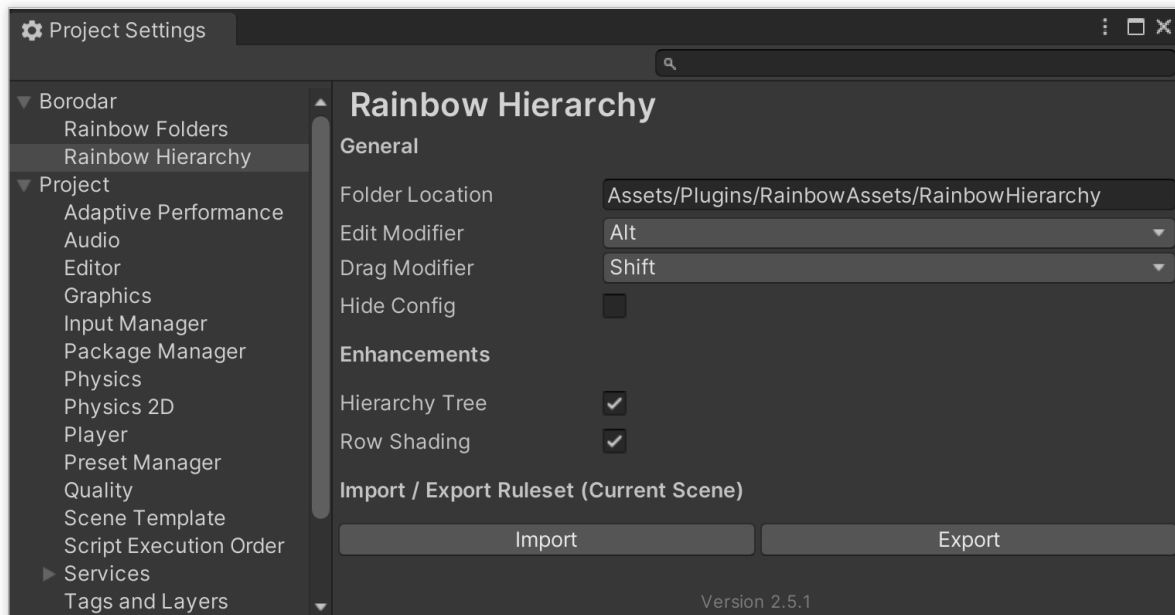
Also, you can filter rules out by their **“Key”** values using the **“Filter by name”** tab.



Please Note: The “RainbowHierarchyRuleset” object is created automatically and managed by the Rainbow Hierarchy. It will not be included in the application build. It stores all the asset settings related to the current scene. You can safely remove it, but all the icons and backgrounds will be reset. Delete this object if you want to remove the Rainbow Hierarchy. This object can be hidden by checking "Hide Config" in the preferences for the Rainbow Hierarchy.

## Import/Export Ruleset

The **Rainbow Hierarchy** asset enables you to preserve and share your icons ruleset as a `.rhset` file. You can archive and store your preferred icon settings for a particular scene and apply them to other scenes, use them for other Unity installations or make them available to your colleagues.



### Exporting rules to .rhset archive

- Open a scene (or multiple scenes) from which you want to export a ruleset.
- Choose **Edit** → **Project Settings** → **Borodar** → **Rainbow Hierarchy** from the main menu.
- Press the “**Export**” button below.
- In the “**Export Ruleset**” dialog specify a location where the ruleset archive will be saved.
- When exporting is done, you could find the `<you-scene-name>.rhset` file in the specified folder.
- If your ruleset contains custom icons, they will be exported to the same folder as the `<you-scene-name>.unitypackage` file.

### Import ruleset from .rhset archive

- Open a scene (or multiple scenes) to which you want to import a ruleset.
- Choose **Edit** → **Project Settings** → **Borodar** → **Rainbow Hierarchy** from the main menu.
- Press the “**Import**” button below.
- In the “**Import Ruleset**” dialog choose a `<scene-name>.rhset` file you want to import.
- If your ruleset contains custom icons and the corresponding `<scene-name>.unitypackage` is located in the same folder, then it will be imported automatically into your project as well.

## Upgrading

Please always do a clean import of the **Rainbow Hierarchy** package (delete the old version before importing the new one). Otherwise, you may receive a number of difficult-to-diagnose issues.

- Delete the `Assets/.../RainbowHierarchy` folder.
- Delete the `Assets/Editor Default Resources/RainbowHierarchy` folder, if exists.
- Import the new version from the package or from the Asset Store.

**ATTENTION!** If you're upgrading **Rainbow Hierarchy** from **v1.1 or lesser** then all your existing icon assignments will be lost! There is no way to upgrade between major versions and save old asset configs due to a significant difference in the way data is stored.
